In January 2018, we as camp staff imagined that Camp Mennoscah would have campers in the summer. We expected to renovate the main camp kitchen and build a new playground. We believed that people would support camp financially and by volunteering. But in 2018, God's plans for Camp Mennoscah were bigger than ours!

A summer of **609 youth campers** exceeded our expectations and was at least a 10-year high. A senior high camp of 167 campers required additional tents and a perfect dining hall table layout to fit everyone. Other camps were fuller than usual, too! Children and youth have many options for how to spend their summer. The fact that hundreds choose a week at Mennoscah points to the powerful way the Spirit moves among people and within creation at camp.

Through several challenges and some delays, the new Whale playground and renovations to the main camp kitchen were completed, with the help of contracted labor and **over 100 volunteers between the two projects!**

The generosity of Camp Mennoscah donors reached beyond our imagination in 2018. When the year ended,

camp had exceeded its general donations goal...**by more than \$33,000!** This huge blessing reminds us that so many people care about Camp Mennoscah's ministry and are committed to sustaining its future.

Regular Giving to Camp Better Than Thursday Coffee

How many times do we drop \$5 on a coffee or \$10 for a movie without even thinking? And we have nothing left at the bottom of the cup or after the credits roll. What if, once a month, you turned that fun money into camp money?

Last year, I wanted to start supporting Camp Mennoscah on a regular basis. I wanted to start putting my money where my heart is. But other bills would come up and life would happen and I would forget. Enter camp's online giving page through Tithe.ly! Tithe.ly is a giving page on the Camp Mennoscah website (there's also a Tithe.ly app) that can take a preset amount (that you decide) and donate it to camp on a schedule you set. Many of my bills are already paid automatically online. But giving to camp feels much better than paying my electric bill. I decided to decrease my weekly budget by \$10 and set up a \$40/month gift that goes straight to camp. And voila... a \$500 per year camp donation that my budget doesn't miss.

So, even a gift of \$5 a month would buy gaga pit balls for camp. And giving \$5 a week (just giving up your regular Thursday coffee) could buy supplies for making lanyards or friendship bracelets. Please consider joining me in supporting camp all year long. I can't think of a better way to spend \$5.

- ◆ Visit campmennoscah.org and click the "Donate Here" (in yellow) at the top of the home page.
- ◆ Select either "Bank Account" or "Credit Card" at the bottom of the giving page.
- ◆ Fill in the amount and payment information.
- ◆ Click the slider next to "set up automated giving."
- ◆ Select "Monthly" (or more frequently) and choose your preferred date.
- ◆ Select "cover the fees" option if you'd like to help camp even more!
- ◆ Click "Give," and you're all set!

You can change the amount and frequency of your gift at any time.

Each April, you can count on seeing one family at Men and Boys Retreat: The Krehbiels. Travis, his sons Jasper and Griffin, brothers Lonnie and Seth Riedel, and friends set up their tents in the picnic area, no matter the weather, as close to the river as possible. Since moving to Kansas when Travis was 8, they have attended nearly every year.



A tradition that began with Travis's father Steve, attending Men and Boys Retreat has been a time of spiritual connection through immersion in God's creation. At the age of two or three, Travis remembers seeing the Camp Mennoscah dam for the first time. "It seemed huge!" he recalled.

At one retreat, Travis and Lonnie were waiting for their dad to return from a river excursion. As dark was approaching, the temperature below 40 degrees, both boys in wet clothing, shivering and hungry, the two lit a fire that was just good enough to provide minimal

warmth and cook a fish. While it was a struggle, the brothers often reminisce about that memorable experience.

For Travis, the best part is the spiritual connection when enjoying God's majesty in nature. "Even when the fish aren't biting, you can see the beavers swim, the birds fly overhead, observe the lizards, mink, bobcats, and deer, and everything is as it is supposed to be." Being able to share this spiritual experience with family keeps the Krehbiel family coming back.


