Three years ago I was asked to be the input speaker for the Junior High 1 Camp. As someone who had never been to a church camp growing up, let alone experienced the unique camping experience of Camp Mennoscah, I wasn't sure what to expect. One of the most profound things I experience each year is seeing the youth connect with God and each other. Walls come down as distractions are stripped away and opportunities for connection are created. The thing that always surprises me about the junior high age group is the creative energy they bring. I like to leverage this by getting the youth involved in the input time through activities, dramas, and even some spiritual practices. While this might get a camper in trouble, in John's case we thank him greatly! John has applied his passion for volunteerism, which he learned from his parents, to numerous camp projects. He enjoys construction and Camp Mennoscah offers the opportunity to use his gifts to help many have good camp experiences. Roofing the Buffalo Room addition



in 1995 is his first memory of helping at camp. After a major hailstorm in 2010 damaged most of the Camp Mennoscah roofs, John helped re-roof many of them.

In 2017 he hatched the creative idea to construct "Sandbar" (the newest boys' cabin) in the fellowship hall of Grace Hill Mennonite Church, where he and his wife Valerie are members. Building at the church increased the involvement of people who had not or could not help on-site at camp. John and Valerie's children have attended and counseled at summer camps, and John hopes that Camp Mennoscah will continue to faithfully connect many kids, church groups, and others to God's goodness as experienced in camp's natural beauty. New Camp Kitchen Dedicated and Open for Use

After several years of anticipation, nearly two years of construction, and hundreds of hours of labor and volunteering, the renovated Camp MennoScah kitchen was dedicated on Sunday, April 22! About sixty people



gathered in the dining hall that afternoon to celebrate this milestone with camp staff and the board of directors, and over the weekend, the new kitchen space was used for the very first time during Men and

Boys Retreat. The equipment is new, the configuration is new, and we have been learning so much about how the new kitchen will function well to serve our cooks, campers, and guest groups!

Arriving at this point could not have been possible without the physical gifts of our volunteers, the financial gifts of our donors, or the prayers of our supporting congregations, families, and individuals. Here are some quick numbers to put into perspective the scope of this work:

- Thousands of prayers!
- 64 volunteers, 745 volunteer hours!
- 160 donors, 230 single donations, from \$1.50 to over \$50,000!

While we have come this far, we're also not finished yet! We are still in need of approximately \$215,000 to take on the completion of the welcome center and dining hall phase of the project. Please consider making a donation to renew these spaces of gathering and fellowship!




